Medicaid Draft Regulations – Nursing Facility Level of Care Determination for Children

The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) is committed to continuously improving the administration of its Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) waiver programs. As part of this process, DHHS solicits feedback from stakeholders who may be impacted by proposed updates to regulations. Recently, a draft of 471 NAC 43, which updates the Nursing Facility Level of Care (NF LOC) criteria for children, was posted to the Medicaid Draft Regulations website and presented during two informal comment sessions held on October 13, 2020, at 5 p.m. Central Daylight Time and October 14, 2020, at noon Central Daylight Time. The current NF LOC for children is located at 471 NAC 12-006. The proposed regulations remove the NF LOC language from Chapter 12 and moves it to a new Chapter 43.

The following content serves as a summary of the proposed regulation changes that were reviewed during the two sessions. This summary covers updates to all pertinent NF LOC criteria for children. The components covered included Criteria Pathways, Medical Treatments, Medical Conditions, an updated definition for "Limitation," Activities of Daily Living (ADLs), and Other Considerations.
