Introductions by Heather

Stephanie Crouch presented on:

- Public Comment Period for State Transition Plan and Traumatic Brain Injury Renewal.
 - Website for STP and TBI shown on screen
 - TBI Renewal happens every five years and once we get the STP approval, we can amend the TBI Waiver to reflect.
- National Core Indicator survey
 - Just finished with success
 - Munroe Myer Institute surveyed 672 clients total in Nursing Facilities, Assisted Livings and Personal Assistance Service
 - It will take about a year to view the results
 - These surveys will continue for this year, 2018/2019
- Two specific websites were shown: Aged and Disabled Waiver and Developmentally Disabled Waiver

Kathy Scheele presented on:

- No Wrong Door Initiative
 - Upcoming Webinar with comments from the Listening Sessions
 - Waiting on gap analysis
 - Heather explained the difference between No Wrong Door and the ADRC (Aged and Disabled Resource Center)
- Long Term Care Case Management RFP Request for Proposal will be going out in the first part of 2019
 - Standardized Assessment across all programs will be a part of this

Larry Iversen presented on:

- Electronic Visit Verification (EVV)
 - Currently working on the compliance date exception
 - CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid) will start receiving cases for exception in July
 - There is a Congressional bill to give an exception to all states until January 1, 2020
 - We have a milestone tentative schedule and project a release for the RFP in November
 - Possible kick off date of April 2019
 - Go Live date of December 2019
