The Compassion and Care for Medically Challenging Pregnancies Act

The Compassion and Care for Medically Challenging Pregnancies Act describes perinatal hospice as “comprehensive support to the pregnant woman and her family that includes support from the time of diagnosis, through the time of birth and the death of the infant, and through the postpartum period. Supportive care may include, but is not limited to, counseling and medical care by maternal-fetal medical specialists, obstetricians, neonatologists, anesthesia specialists, clergy, social workers, and specialty nurses focused on alleviating fear and ensuring that the woman and her family experience the life and death of their child in a comfortable and supportive environment.”

Perinatal hospice services may include:

- Support throughout the pregnancy, delivery, and post-partum period
- Guidance regarding medical decisions
- Assistance with making memories, pictures, or keepsakes
- Personalized birth plan
- Pain relief for baby if necessary
- Memorial or Funeral Service guidance
- Coordinating discharge from hospital to home or Hospice program

Once the child is born, our hospice is able to sign the baby onto services to offer comprehensive hospice nursing and social services in the family home until the time of the patient's death. Once the baby has died supportive bereavement services are engaged to provide companioning grief support to all members of the family. Endless Journey employs a Certified Child Life Specialist (CCLS) to provide developmentally appropriate grief support to siblings of the baby and also anticipatory guidance to caregivers sharing news of the perinatal diagnosis prior to birth. Endless Journey hospice is a hospice only program. We do not have a perinatal physician on service who can provide palliative OB care to a mother prior to the baby's birth.
