

Overview of the Nebraska WIC Program for WIC-authorized Retailers

What is WIC?

- WIC stands for The Special Supplement Nutrition Program for Women's, Infants, and Children.
- o Families visit WIC clinics for a variety of services including:
 - Nutritional assessment and education
 - Prenatal care
 - Breastfeeding promotion and counselling
 - Benefits for purchasing supplemental, nutritious foods (This is where you come in.)

• The retailer's role

- A retailer outlet may be authorized to sell WIC-approved foods to WIC participants. Participants are given an eWIC card which is similar to a debit card. Food benefits are loaded to the card, and participants may then go shopping at your store to purchase WIC foods for which they have benefits. Each member of a family have a different set of benefits depending on their specific nutritional needs. The food benefits from all participants in one family will be on the same card.

How WIC Works

- Participants are assessed at WIC clinics. They receive their eWIC card with food benefits, a Food List & Shopping Guide for identifying WIC-approved foods, and they receive training on how to shop
- Participant then visits a WIC-authorized retailer and shops for their specific WIC foods
- At the register, the cashier offers good customer service by assisting the customer in troubleshooting any foods their WIC benefits are not paying for
- Participant returns home and consumes nutritious foods provided by the Nebraska WIC Program
