Cost of Tuition for CAAs, CRNAs, PAs

CAA (UMKC)

- Tuition per year
 - \$32,462 (resident)
 - \$38,975 (non-resident)
- Tuition Cost (Program)
 - \$65,283 (resident)
 - \$77,950 (non-resident)

PA (UNMC)

- Tuition per year
 - \$18,950 (resident)
 - \$49,260 (non-resident)
- Total Costs (per year)
 - \$55,545 (resident)
 - \$87,135 (non-resident)
- Program Cost
 - \$109,005 (resident)
 - \$172,180 (non-resident)

CRNA (Clarkson)

- Tuition per year
 - \$25,301 per year
- Program Costs
 - \$64,111 (based on 61 hours at \$1051 per hour)
 - \$95,436

Benefits of CAAs in Rural Settings

Rural Pass Through

Nurse Anesthetists work at 100% of critical access hospitals in Nebraska.

- Currently there are 63 critical access hospitals in Nebraska

CRNA's and CAA's can "pass-through" Medicare Part B and bill from Part A.

Does not include physician anesthesiologists

Limits the ability of physicians to practice in rural settings.

CMS will not permit hospitals to use pass-through arrangement for physician services.

3. Nurse Midwives – 39
4. Physician Assistants – 1087

Physicians in Nebraska – 4906

- Care provided by a variety of healthcare providers in Nebraska
- Each geographic area, hospital, group gets to determine their need

Licensure Comparisons

Physician Assistant Licensure

- Master's Program (2+ years)
- Same pre-requisites as medical school

Certified Anesthesiologist Assistant Licensure

- Master's Program (2+ years)
- Same pre-requisites as medical school

Practice Comparison

- **Physician Assistant
Licensure**

- Work with under supervision of physicians to provide care

- **Certified Anesthesiologist
Assistant Licensure**

- Work with under supervision of physicians to provide care

CAA's represent another advanced practice provider able to provide essential anesthesia services to Nebraskans.

12.6% growth between 2020 and 2030



 - 3 Physicians
 - 12 CRNAs
- Loper Hospital
 - 3 Physicians
 - 8 CRNAs
 - 4 CAAs
- All run 12 rooms
- All able to accommodate changes in providers (CAA for CRNA and vis a versa)
- Both provide safe, quality care for patients

Billing with CAAs or CRNAs

- Anesthetic billing is base units + time (15-minute increments)
 - Cataract – 4 units + time
 - Liver Transplant – 29 units + time
- That billing is shared within the care team model
 - CAA/CRNA gets 50%, physician gets 50%
 - If independent practice (QZ billing), CRNA would get 100%
 - QZ billing does not always indicate no physician involvement
 - Nebraska Medicine bills QZ but has physician oversight

Billing with CAAs or CRNAs

- Insurance does not pay an increased cost for CAAs within the care team model
- Taxpayers (Medicare, Medicaid) does not incur higher costs for CAAs within the care team model

Modifier	Description	Payment
AA	Anesthesia Services performed personally by the anesthesiologist	100% of the allowed amount to the physician anesthesiologist
AD	Medical Supervision by a physician; more than 4 concurrent anesthesia procedures	The Part B Contractor may allow only three base units per procedure when the anesthesiologist is involved in furnishing more than four procedures concurrently or is performing other services while directing the concurrent procedures. An additional time unit may be recognized if the physician can document he or she was present at induction.
QK	Medical direction of two, three or four concurrent anesthesia procedures involving qualified individuals	The allowed amount is evenly split between the physician anesthesiologist and the qualified nonphysician anesthetist(s)
QX	Qualified nonphysician anesthetist with medical direction by a physician	The allowed amount is evenly split between the physician anesthesiologist and the qualified nonphysician anesthetist
QY	Medical direction of one qualified nonphysician anesthetist by an anesthesiologist	The allowed amount is evenly split between the physician anesthesiologist and the qualified nonphysician anesthetist
QZ	CRNA without medical direction by a physician	The nurse anesthetist receives 100% of the allowed amount
