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#### **DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE UPDATES**

Kaylie Fritts, DVM, Deputy Nebraska State Veterinarian with the Agriculture Department was present for discussion with the Board.

H5N1or Avian Influenza - Nebraska has had 5 reported cases in December, 2 commercial flocks and 3 backyard flocks. In January there has been 2 reported backyard flocks. It's important that owners that suspect that they have a case in their flock that they **do not** bring the birds to a clinic, but rather contact the Department of Agriculture and a veterinarian will come to the farm and determine if the flock needs to be tested. The USDA will compensate the cost for testing and if there is a loss to the flock USDA will also compensate appropriately for the loss of the flock.

Nebraska livestock has not had a positive detection of the H5N1 to date. Nebraska does participate with the mandatory USDA surveillance program where they have the milk silos tested for the virus and all testing has been negative to date.

As far as cats and the human population, cats are susceptible. There have been reported cases in Texas where cats drank infected milk at a dairy and have died. So, the basic rule is don't drink raw milk and don't feed your pets raw food. Cooked, pasteurized/processed pet food has virtually no issues.

Human population detection noted have all come from people drinking raw milk. Symptoms range from mild respiratory and conjunctivitis type symptoms, and they all recovered at home. There is no risk if you drink pasteurized milk, it is safe to consume.

Brucellosis vaccines are on backorder, producers that can't get the vaccine call the Department of Agriculture and they can assist.

The electronic ID tags are available to accredited DVM's in Nebraska.

#### **2024 LEGISLATION UPDATES**

Jessika Benes, DVM, Juniata, NE and Nebraska Veterinary Medical Association (NVMA) Board of Directors member was present to discuss the 2025 Legislation Bills that have been introduced that the NEVMA will be following and may be of interest to the Board.

<u>LB665</u> - Prohibit the use of certain electronic identification devices under the Animal Health and Disease Control Act.

Hearing scheduled for February 11, 2025

The NVMA opposes this bill and will be testifying at the hearing.

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#### **EMAIL BALLOT(S) SINCE THE LAST BOARD MEETING**

An Email Ballot was sent to the Board for consideration for approval of the Draft Regulation for Title 172 Chapter 180 Practice of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery. By a vote of 4/0 the Board recommended to approve the Draft Regulations as written.

#### **DISCUSSION(S)**

A. Potential for Legislative change regarding the Veterinary profession for VCPR (Veterinary Client Patient Relationship) should it be expanded to include establishing VCPR through Telemedicine.

After much discussion it was suggested that Dr. Farrington would send information to Vonda Apking, Program Manager to format and send on to Katherine Amyot, DHHS Legal Attorney. Ms. Amyot will then develop a document for a Model Bill to be presented to gain interest of a Senator who in turn can propose a Legislative Bill for a change in the Statutes which will enable the establishment of VCPR through Telemedicine.

B. Potential for Legislative change to include the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act in the Telehealth Practice Act (38-1,143)

This discussion will be tabled and addressed at the next meeting for the formation of a Special Committee to study and develop the need to include the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act in the Telehealth Practice Act.

## **PRACTICE QUESTION(S)**

A. Is Medical Marijuana for animal use legal in Nebraska?

It is the opinion of the Board that Medical Marijuana for animal use is not legal in Nebraska. Currently there is no change in State Legislation that would make it legal.

B. Is hemp oil legal for animal use in Nebraska?

It is the opinion of the Board that you should consult with your personal attorney. Refer to the Nebraska Revised Statute 2-515: https://nebraskalegislature.gov/laws/statutes.php?statute=2-515
